

Enforcement of the Parking Restrictions

Starting at 8:00 a.m. after a Snow Emergency has been declared, any vehicle parked in violation of the Snow Emergency Parking Restrictions may be towed at the owners expense.

It is strongly advised that vehicle owners move their vehicles as soon as a Snow Emergency is declared.

Town Police and the Public Works Departments will make every effort to inform a vehicle owner of the need for the vehicle to be moved. However, vehicles not moved may be towed.

If your vehicle is towed, contact the Middlebury Police Department at 825-9111. A towed vehicle will be released upon payment by the owner of the vehicle for all towing and storage expenses.



The Town's snow emergency parking restrictions are designed to keep streets safe and passable for emergency travel during extreme snow events.

This can be a difficult challenge in a town with narrow streets, but impassible streets and snowed-in parked vehicles are a major hazard to residents, businesses and, above all, to first responders on police, fire or emergency medical calls.

To ensure effective snow removal and to keep traffic moving safely, the Town's snow emergency parking restrictions are designed to allow for snow removal crews to do their job during extreme weather conditions.

Declaration of a Snow Emergency

A Snow Emergency may be declared by Town officials during or after a snowstorm when weather conditions create hazardous road conditions and parking hinders the proper clearing and removal of snow on public streets.

Notification of a declared Snow Emergency will be communicated through:

- Local television and radio stations;
- Local newspapers;
- Notice on the Town's website www.middleburyin.com and on the Town's Facebook page; and
- Town Hall at 825-1499 or the Police Department at 825-9111.

Snow Emergency Parking Restrictions apply to all public streets starting at 8:00 a.m. after the declared emergency.

Parking Restrictions will remain in effect until the Snow Emergency is terminated by the Town.



Parking Restrictions during a Snow Emergency

During a Snow Emergency, the following parking restrictions are in effect on all public streets except all of Main Street and East Warren Street from State Street to Main Street:

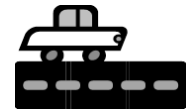
- Parking is permitted only on the odd numbered side of the street on odd numbered days of the month;
- Parking is permitted only on the even numbered side of the street on even numbered days of the month;
- On streets posted No Parking on one side of the street, follow the odd/even parking. Parking on the No Parking side of the street is allowed;
- No parking is allowed on either side of a dead-end street within 100 feet of the dead-end;
- No parking is allowed within the circle of any cul-de-sac.



How to Park during a Snow Emergency

The best place to park during a Snow Emergency is off a public street. If you cannot park off the street, you should park as shown below.
